

Live Transcribe and Live Caption on your cell phone- Android or iPhone:

This will transcribe spoken words/audio into written words in real-time and the text will display on your phone screen to enhancing comprehension

ON AN **ANDROID DEVICE:**

"Live Transcribe" focuses on transcribing conversations and audio around you, offering a written record of spoken words.

"Live Caption" provides real-time captions for phone calls and media

How to **Enable “Live Transcribe”** on your Android device:

1. Open your device's *Settings app*
 2. Scroll down and tap on *Accessibility*.
 3. Scroll down to the Captions section and tap on “*Live Transcribe*”. You can also find “live transcribe” under the "Hearing" section.
 4. Tap on “Open Live Transcribe”
- The first time you open Live Transcribe, you'll be prompted to grant microphone access
 - Tap “While using the app” to continue.
 - The Live Transcribe app will open, and you'll see the transcription appear as text in real-time.

Using Live Transcribe:

- **Real-time transcription:** Live Transcribe will transcribe any speech it detects.
- **Sound detection:** It also indicates non-speech sounds like laughing or knocking.
- **Keyboard:** You can type replies on the Live Transcribe screen using the on-screen keyboard.
- **Shortcut:** You can enable a floating icon to access Live Transcribe from anywhere.

On **Android phones, "Live Caption"** automatically captions speech on your device for phone calls, audio messages, and media like videos and podcasts. It's accessible through the Accessibility setting.

To enable **Live Caption on your Android device:**

How to Enable:

- a. Open your device's Settings.
- b. Go to Accessibility.
- c. Select "Live Caption"
- d. Toggle on the "Use Live Caption" switch.
- e. Read the message about Live Caption and click "OK".

ON AN iPhone:

"Live Captions" is a built-in accessibility feature on the iPhone that automatically transcribes spoken audio in real-time and displays it as captions on your phone screen, making it easier to follow live conversations or even audio content in apps like FaceTime and Podcasts.

"Live Transcribe" is a separate app (available on the App Store) that provides similar functionality as the "live captions", offering features like captioning even through face coverings.

Availability:

- ***"Live Captions" is available on iPhone 11 and later*** when the primary language is set to English (U.S.) or English (Canada).
- You can customize the appearance of the captions, such as text size, color, and background.

On iPhone, you can use **"Live Captions"** to transcribe spoken audio in real-time, either from apps or from conversations around you (on iPhone 11 and later)

To **enable the "Live Captions"** feature go to:

1. Settings
2. Accessibility
3. Scroll down to the "HEARING" section and find Live Captions
4. Toggle the feature on and adjust appearance settings
5. You can also turn on the "Live captions in FaceTime" feature

You can also add Live Captions in the Accessibility Shortcut for quick access by going to:

1. Settings
2. Accessibility
3. Accessibility Shortcut and selecting Live Captions

Using Live Captions:

- **Transcribe In-Person Conversations:** Tap Live Captions, then tap Microphone.
- **Transcribe iPhone Audio:** Tap Live Captions, then tap iPhone Audio.
- **Pause Transcription:** Tap Live Captions, then tap Pause Listening.

Live Captions in Notes:

You can also record audio and transcribe it in the Notes app.

An additional feature on iPhone under accessibility: “Live Speech”

- *What does this feature do?* “Live speech” speaks aloud what you type using the speaker and in calls
